North Penn Water Authority is responsible for maintaining all the fire hydrants in our service area. We have almost 3,200 of them. Each year, as part of our 7-week spring flushing program, we inspect and operate every single hydrant to ensure that they are functioning properly. Annual flushing is an important maintenance measure to ensure that we are delivering the highest water quality in our over 500 miles of distribution system piping. As part of that effort, if we find that any hydrant repairs are necessary, we make sure we take care of it promptly. Obviously, it is critical for public safety that all hydrants work properly when they are needed in an emergency to fight a fire.

Only employees of the North Penn Water Authority or members of the local fire departments are authorized to operate a fire hydrant. It is illegal for anyone else to operate or otherwise tamper with a fire hydrant because it is a potential threat to public safety. This type of offense can and will be prosecuted to the fullest extent of the law.

We would like to ask all our customers to help us by keeping an eye out for anyone who may be withdrawing water from a fire hydrant, or attempting to tamper with it in any way. If you see anything that looks suspicious, please call us immediately. If it is after normal business hours, our office's outgoing phone message will direct you to our 24-hour emergency phone number. Thank you for your cooperation in helping us to protect the water supply that we all rely on.

Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Drop-off Program

When cleaning out garages, basements, attics, or storage closets, help protect the community watershed by properly disposing of household hazardous materials. In Montgomery County, HHW collection sites, which also will accept computer electronics, will be at the following locations from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. rain or shine:

June 14 Montgomery County Community College – use entrance on Cathcart Rd., Blue Bell

June 28 Spring-Ford School District's Flex School – 833 S. Lewis Road, Royersford August 2 Springfield School District – use entrance at 500 Haws Lane, Flourtown

October 25 Lower Merion Transfer Station – 1300 Woodbine Ave., Penn Valley

Among the products that may be recycled are used motor oil, brake fluid, gasoline, rug cleaner, drain and oven cleaner, dyes, swimming pool chemicals, paint remover and oil-based paint.
